What is the Meaning/Definition of Skating

This is a steering activity that uses specific equipment (skates) on an unusual surface (ice).

Why Ice Skating at School?

- > It meets the 3 lines of development within PE:
 - > movement skills
 - > co-operation and competition
 - > evaluating and appreciating
- > It contributes in creating "Confident Individuals"

OUR APPROACH TO PE

An educational approach is implemented through games and adjustment of the environment allowing the child to forget his/her apprehension of the ice. After a discovery phase, the coach adjusts and modulates the session based on age and abilities.

The educational process principles are:

- > Let the pupil act.
- > Encourage activity of exploring and testing (favouring a large amount of actions).
- Changing situations to diversify the motor skills using variables (space, time, equipment, partner, actions...).

Learn of a new balancing structure through a narrow footprint (skate blade) on a frictionless medium.

> LOCOMOTION MOTOR SKILLS > > Building a pro

- Building a propulsion (from walking to gliding).
- Mastering various trajectories (straight, curved).
- Creating backward movement

> CO-ORDINATION

- Segmental dissociation; look/supports dissociation.
- >Impulsion/landing.

Go from fear of falling to pleasure of gliding

- Accept to undertake risk (amplitude, speed).
- >Acting without help.

1. Welcome

The children are welcomed half an hour before the start of their session by the ice rink staff at the main entrance.

The children are brought to skate hire where they will find the safety equipment.

Ensure that children are wearing gloves and long socks.

Urge families on the need for appropriate clothing for this activity.

2. Educational Team

It is composed of the school teacher and MIR resident ice skating coaches.

Those coaches are registered with NISA (National Ice Skating Association), they are fully insured and qualified to teach children on the ice.

For one classroom, two coaches will be on the ice with the children.

The teacher has the choice of going on with his/her pupils or to stand by the side of the rink.
